# **Course Structure**

In order to take Music at KS4, pupils *must* be able to play a musical instrument or sing to a good standard. You will also be expected to take part in *at least* 1 musical extra-curricular activity.

WJEC is developing a reformed GCSE Music qualification for first teaching from September 2016. The current course is based on skills learned in years 7 to 9. It contains a range of musical activities in which pupils show a keen interest, some of which are from the area of rock and pop music. Pupils are encouraged to perform both in and out of school in whatever musical style interests them.

#### Careers

Performing, acting, theatre and backstage work, radio and TV, Teaching (classroom, peripatetic, private) Military and Brass Bands (HM Forces), Recording, publishing, distribution and retail, agency and PR work, arts journalism, management and marketing, instrument making and repair.









## **Examination/Assessment**

#### Appraising (30%)

Written exam testing pupils' skill in interpreting what they hear.

#### Performing (30%)


Two performances, one solo, one as part of a group which will be marked in school

#### Composing (40%)

Pupils compose and arranged a variety of pieces. Two of these will be chosen for submitting as coursework.
